Executive Director

In 2021, the demand for Big Picture's services and programs grew beyond the capacity of the volunteer board.



The organization hired its first executive director, Dr. Mae Gilliland Wright, in June.

Dr. Mae, as she is known by students, holds a Master's Degree and Doctor of Philosophy in the digital humanities field from the University of Edinburgh, Scotland. In addition to her position as Executive Director at Big Picture, she is an adjunct professor at Bradley University. Mae is a freelance writer, ghostwriter, and consultant, and has a teaching background in the sciences and humanities. She currently sits on the Board of Directors for the Women's Fund of the Community Foundation of Central Illinois and the City of Peoria's Public Arts Advisory Commission. In the past, she sat on the Board of Directors for ArtsPartners of Central Illinois, where she served as the Vice President and chaired the Sky Art Peoria committee. She also served on the Board of Directors of Acorn Equality Fund, the Public Relations Association of Central Illinois, and ART, Inc., along with various other committees with area organizations like Align Peoria and the Community Foundation of Central Illinois.







Big Picture Initiative hiring artists for downtown murals recognizing influential Peoria figures







